5. Milwaukee County Prevention Services – Light and Unite Red

Nzinga Khalid, Prevention Coordinator for Milwaukee County, outlined the many initiatives for Light and Unite Red Week, January 23 – 27, which include:

6. Coalition goals and initiatives for 2017

DFC Year 9 Continuation has been approved. These initiatives include WAPD compliance checks, Hispanic Health Fair implementation, Coalition member survey and youth initiatives.

Partnership for Success Grant II has also been approved to support Coalition efforts around prescription drug abuse including senior safety talks, drug take backs and prescriber education.

The Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) grant will be completed in 2017.

15. Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS)

Tammy Molter and Sabley Sabine shared information from the latest YRBS survey showing 9th grade data. Perception of peer disapproval showed the most gains with positive results for all substances; alcohol, tobacco, prescription drugs and marijuana. Perception of risk, especially marijuana and tobacco, continues to be an issue.

Screening Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT)

The final report for the SBIRT grant, which included universal screening of all 9th graders in the 2015-2016 school year, will be available in early 2018. More information will be shared at an upcoming meeting.

The Coalition continues to explore funding options to resume universal screening of all 9th grade students in the near future.

16. CADCA (Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America) SBIRT project

Tammy Molter and Sabley Sabine attended a national meeting this summer to share our experience with SBIRT and universal screening in schools. WAWMCC was one of five coalitions in the country selected by CADCA (Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America) to receive a two-year \$10,000 grant to assess and explore the feasibility of SBIRT being conducted for youth in a community based healthcare setting. The coalition has begun by surveying families at the West Allis Health Department flu clinics to see if teens go to the doctor at least once a year. The next step is to contact local health care agencies to see if they currently conduct SBIRT, including with youth, and how the coalition can collaborate with them or help them to overcome barriers. Another goal will be to assess the feasibility of establishing a possible partnership with healthcare providers to conduct universal SBIRT with 9th graders in the WAWM School District in the future.

17. Sustainability Update

WAWMCC has submitted a grant proposal to West Allis Rotary to fund the Peers with Purpose program.

A \$2000 grant was received from the Alliance for WI Youth to fund compliance checks with WAPD.

The Partnership for Success grant (PFS15) has also been renewed to cover the costs for senior safety talks and printing of Coalition materials, such as Med Logs, Talk to brochure and drop-off magnets in 2017-2018.

18. Updates

Kristen Swofford provided a youth update on some of the upcoming projects, including Red Ribbon Week, Light and Unite Red in January 2018 and the peers training scheduled for February 2018. Each high school has a SADD Chapter (Students Against Destructive Decisions) which will be working on these and other student developed projects.

Nzinga Khalid, Prevention Coordinator for Milwaukee County, gave a brief update about some of the initiatives for Light and Unite Red Week, January 22 – 26, 2018. WAWMCC will also participate in the activities including youth led projects at the schools and collaborations with community partners.

A suggestion was made to develop a business sized card to promote the SAMHSA parent app with information about talking to your child about preventing substance abuse.

A reminder was given to participate in the Coalition Survey before it is closed at the end of the week. A summary of the results will be given at the November meeting.

23. Public input

Joanie Luedke from the WAWM Heroin/Opiate Task Force shared information about Safe and Supported program in schools, small group discussions at each school. Stay Strong West Allis is an outreach tem for after an overdose. Within 72 hours, the person will receive a connection to treatment. The task force is also working on community outreach to raise awareness.

Morgyn Steinbrecker and Daniel Biziak from the West Milwaukee Treatment Center shared information about their organization. The center is geared for adults offering a 2-year program including methadone, counseling and therapy. The goal is to restabilize the client and their family.

Rafal Mercado from Milwaukee Heroin Diaries shared information and stories from his organization. They listen to the needs of the community and bring awareness to issues and silent voices.

24. Youth update

Sydney Shotten from Nathan Hale High School shared some of the projects the youth members were working on for the school year.

- Nathan Hale is promoting a wear red day on November 16 to promote Red Ribbon Week. A message was also placed in the fence outside the cafeteria and posters with red origami stars were created to share the prevention message.
- Central created a display in the cafeteria using a chain of red links to share the Red Ribbon Week prevention message and also held a wear red day.
- Learning Center is creating a resource area in the school that will have information about preventing alcohol and drug abuse.
- Shared Journey is creating a SADD (Students Against Destructive Decisions) Chapter and will again be designing the West Allis Library Display for April as Alcohol Awareness Month.

25. Underage alcohol abuse

Lt. Jessica Johnson of the West Allis Police Department shared the following information about from this past year:

- Tobacco compliance checks (also look at vaping) done in March, June and October for a total of 39 stores, all complied.
- Tavern compliance checks done in June, September and November for a total of 28 with 25 complying and 3 citations.
- Liquor store compliance checks done in March, June, August and September for a total of 49 with 45 complying and 4 citations.
- Over 46 pounds of medication was collected during the Senior Safety Talks.

Officer Sean Patyk from the West Milwaukee Police Department shared the following information from this past year:

- Compliance checks done quarterly.
- Trend is more towards drugs than alcohol.
- Officer Patyk is available to conduct DITEP (Drug Impairment Training for Education Professionals) training for the community.

26. West Allis Fire Department

Lt. Dave Bandomir from the West Allis Fire Department shared the following information from this past year:

- Video and flyer from the September Safety Night was shared. The video is available on the WAWM Heroin/Opiate Task Force Facebook page.
- City website now shows map where Narcan is administered, deaths, etc.
- Reminder to always call 911 first
- Stop the Bleed training now being offered and kits in AED cabinets.

- Hands Only CPR AED in community areas sponsored by Rotary and Knights of Columbus.
- Hands Only CPR and Stop the Bleed training offered after Coalition Meeting.

27. Coalition membership survey

Julie Whelan Capell, WAWMCC Evaluator, shared information from the latest membership survey, completed by 18 participants. Funding stability, which the Coalition is continuously working on, was one of the indicators that needed further work. Partnerships, including communicating with community leaders and having these leaders involved in the programs were strong both ratings. The Coalition and Steering Committee will continue to explore sustainability options with the help of community partners and leaders. The survey is available upon request.
