Eric has been a Special Agent with the Wisconsin Department of Justice/ Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) for approximately 20 years. He's currently assigned to the state's Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force in Milwaukee. Eric's law enforcement experience also includes undercover murder-for-hire, homicide, cold-case homicides, tracking fugitives, and drug enforcement.

Eric's dynamic presentations on Internet and cell phone exploitation of children have been seen by more than 210,000 people in Wisconsin and the U.S. Audiences include police officers, prosecutors, child welfare advocates, correctional and social workers, civic groups, business professionals, doctors, parents, and middle school and high school students.
